1.	<p style="text-align: center;">SPORTS SHEAR AUSTRALIA ASSOCIATION Inc            CHAIRMANS REPORT AGM 24<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2025 Jamestown</p> <p>Sports Shear Australia Association Inc            Chairmans report AGM Jamestown South Australia October 24th, 2025            Welcome Sponsors, ECOM members, committee members and guests.            2025 has been another exciting year with interests from both Dubbo and Geelong putting forward submissions for hosting the 2029 Golden Shears World Championships. It's been over 20 years since we last held a World event at Toowoomba in 2005 and prior to that was Perth in 1986.            On behalf on Sports Shear Australia a big thank you to our sponsors AWI, Stockowners Shearing, Parkdale SRS poll merino stud, Fox and Lillee and Alexander Schoff who have generously supported us throughout the year and for the national event this weekend. Through the tough time of sheep numbers decreasing, it</p>	

is fantastic to see competitor numbers holding firm throughout the year.

The Trans-Tasman teams have represented Australia to the highest of levels with excellent results amongst all the three different events. 2026 will see a change in the Trans-Tasman due to the Golden shear's world event being hosted by Masterton New Zealand. Woolhandling Trans-Tasman will be held at Balclutha show South Island NZ February 14th and a week later the machine shears event at Gore NZ. This brings the issue of managers staying over for an extended time or do we now use this situation and include the Judges as a stand in manager for 2026 thus eliminating this major expense of accommodating a manager.

Thank you to the Judges and manager who represented SSAA at Masterton earlier this year.

This year is a qualifying event for the World team selection.

Jamestown will be supplying a variation in stock with both crossbred and merinos to be used in the qualifying rounds.

A big thank you to Matt Scharkie, Steph Lunn and all the committee at Jamestown for hosting their second National event in three years. With a new 3 stand wool handling board this will be an exciting event with the best competitors from all states wanting that elusive win.

2025 we welcomed Queensland as a member of SSAA. I had the opportunity of attending Warwick and Tara shows in Qld early this year and a credit to this new association on their achievements of pointing their state on an exciting pathway.

After some years of discussions and negotiations Campbelltown Tasmania has taken possession of a new shearing and woolhandling facility at the local show grounds. From photos I have seen it looks amazing. I wish Sports Shear Tasmania all the best on the new facility and hopefully we may see a national event soon.

All states are urged to include every show committee in the decisions that form your association. It is these show committees who put in the time and effort to set up and run events and it is extremely important that they are included in all decisions. No association operates without difference of opinions within, but over recent years it seems to be increasing with factions within states. I encourage all associations to operate within their constitutions and decisions made are of the best interest of our industry and Sports Shear Australia

This leads me to selection of managers, Judges and committee members. These positions are all voluntary and, in our selections, today I urge all ECOM members to vote for those dedicated to being the best ambassador to our association. These positions are quite demanding, and the importance of fitness and capabilities overrides any personal gains.

The decision on who will put forward a submission to the Golden shears' world council rests on you here today and I ask that we stand by and support the successful applicant. It is important that we back Australia to get this submission over the line.

Finally thank you to Tammy Mudford who stepped in at the last minute as a secretary. With your own personal work commitments, it's been difficult for you to juggle, thank you.

• Suggested that the rules are dated in line with the AWEX COP dates & have a version control at the footer. Also suggested that state head wool judges send in to the National head wool judge a continuous improvement list to be reviewed & amendments made inline with the AWEX COP

• On the 14/9/25 a protocols zoom meeting was held and the wool handling rules and guidelines were ratified. (A copy of the minutes are attached). Changes made for shearing & wool rules: blood rule, no catcher in the pen when shearing & wool are running together

• We had our head state wool judge zoom meeting in September. Discussions on – state wool judge reps & experience, roster (rotations if time permits, no judging of family members), dress code for the weekend, teamwork, rules & guidelines.

Finally, I look forward to working with you all over the weekend, seeing all state teams competing and the wool judges working as a team. Have a great weekend.
