After four years I believe its time to step aside and invite innovative ideas and new thinking to take the lead.</p> <p>A big thanks to our major sponsors AWI, Prime Super. Stockowners Shearing and many thanks to our minor sponsors Parkdale Poll merino stud, Fox and Lillee and everyone who assisted SSAA along the way.</p>	



	<p>Thank you to the Katanning Shears committee for hosting SSAA and The National Shearing and Woolhandling Championship in 2024. I believe this to be one of the best events we have had. Congratulations also on being awarded an Australian Day award for this event. This is the third time an award that been given to SSAA national event over the last few years with Dubbo 2019 and Jamestown 2023 also awarded for their achievements.</p> <p>Jamestown is pushing ahead and I look forward to October at the National event</p> <p>Congratulations and a big thank you to our Trans-Tasman teams who competed or officiated at the recent Golden Shears at Masterton. Points to be tallied and State final at Campbell town Show end of May 30th and 31st</p> <p>SSSA. - everything going pretty well but Mt Pleasant had to be cancelled due to the extreme weather. Stand alone state selection at Karoonda. Meeting 2 weeks ago and all going on long ok. The Dry is not helping Karoonda so will be a struggle over next few weeks.</p> <p>WACSA – Thank you Tammy for undertaking on the role of Secretary for Sports Shear Australia at the special meeting conducted in early November. Thank you to David, Raelene, Tom, Marion and Daryl for going around again and your ongoing hard work for Sports Shear Australia. WACSA are here to support you where we are able.</p> <p>Thank you to everyone for attending the National competition at Katanning and the many hours of work and preparation put in by all to make it such a successful event. A huge congratulations to the Katanning Shear Committee, and especially Kaupz King-Tidey for their massive efforts, not forgetting the three new shearing stand space built by David. 	<p>previous. There have been a good number of competitors at each event and a stable group of judges and supporters, albeit all getting a little older. There are a couple younger judges showing interest though more would be very welcome, especially for the Wool Handling.</p> <p>Our AGM was conducted mid-February with over thirty people in attendance, which is a very healthy sign for our organisation. In order of fairness to all National event’s prior agreement from ECOM regarding number of judges representing their state at a national event. At this stage AWI provides financial assistance for two shearing and two woolhandling judges to represent their state. • Competitors competing in two grades at state level. For a fair and even competition, competitors that compete in two grades at state level should only be eligible to represent their state at the national event at the higher grade level. Many competitors are gaining experience in the higher grade for a considerable amount of time then, qualifying at the lower grade thus gaining an unfair advantage to competitors from states allowing one grade only. • Eligibility to represent more than once at a National level. Currently competitors are only permitted to represent a state at that level once. Novice competitors are only eligible to compete for 12 months as a novice competitor as per the current SSAA rules.
